


You Can Help Gloria Witt Win

Lots of Volunteer Options Every Thursday 5-7pm

It's Thursday, so we'll be at Ix Park from 5pm to 7pm... let's keep the huge national momentum going here!

Volunteers (even babies!) are signing up and working at record rates for the Dems. We need everyone's assistance to win in November!

We'll gather by the picnic table outside of Brazos Tacos. From there, we can spread out to do a number of different tasks, including canvassing, our largest need. If you're planning on writing postcards or making phone calls, bring a



blanket or chair so you can sit on the lawn under the trees. If you want a drink or snack while you're working, you can sit at a table on the Brazos patio (or grab a table inside Brazos if you can't stand the heat).

On August 29:

Charlie from the Coordinated Campaign will be there to get folks set up with phone banking and canvassing. Both of these are important because the more actual interactions we have with folks, the better.

Frances will be there to work with folks wanting to respond to texts to rural voters, sent out by Rural Ground Game. If you're planning on responding to texts, you'll need to bring a laptop or tablet to work with.

Early Voting Starts Sept. 20

Why not get voting out of the way long before the lines that may form on Tuesday, Nov. 5? You can vote early at the Office of Voter Registration 45 days before each election, starting Sept. 20 during all office hours (normally 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM,

Mon - Fri) and early voting ends at 5pm on Saturday, Nov. 2, the last Saturday before the election. The office is open the last two Saturdays before the election; the office may set additional hours. After early voting ends, you may cast a ballot at your precinct voting location on Nov. 5, Election Day. For more information:
