Jan. 6 Reorganization Meeting (with music and food!) Opportunities for New People with New Ideas!

Date/Time: January 6 at 1pm (you must arrive before 2pm to vote!!)

Location: Carver Recreation Center, 233 4th Street, NW,

Charlottesville, VA 22902

NOTE: some snow is forecast, but we don't expect it will be severe enough to force a rescheduling; if we do need to cancel we'll send out an email by 11am (and post the cancellation on our website and Facebook).

Schedule:

- During the 1-2pm registration hour we'll be chatting with attendees and signing up volunteers. We'll have light food (fresh apple juice, coffee, and homemade scones) and live acoustic music. Current precinct committee members should arrive early to greet attendees, especially those new to us, and help them find the volunteer signup table(s) that match their interest(s) such as GOTV, event planning, helping with petitions, media, etc.
- At 2pm sharp, the doors close (no one arriving after 2pm will be allowed in) and we switch over to election business (should only take about an hour):
- Attendees who we've signed in by 2pm will elect Precinct Representatives, who then choose either a chair or two co-chairs for each precinct. Anyone who lives in and is registered to vote in Charlottesville is eligible to stand for election to become a member of our committee and have a voice in shaping our local party's actions and positions on issues.
- 2. The Precinct Representatives and ex officio members, who together make up the Charlottesville Democratic Committee ("The Full Committee"), will then elect candidates for the following offices (listed with all candidates who have so far generously offered to run for them):

Co-Chairs: Josh Throneburg and Nancy Damon

Vice-Chair: still seeking candidate(s)

Treasurer: Jason Vandever is willing to stay on

Secretary: still seeking candidate(s)

Note that we have four other positions on the Executive Committee that are appointed, not elected:

Communications: Mary Jane Gore has volunteered to serve. **Voter Registration**: Suzanne Michels is willing to stay on, **Voter Protection**: Jeremy Jones is willing to stay on.

Fundraising: still seeking candidate(s).

Layperson descriptions of these various offices are on our website; full descriptions of the precinct roles (and officer roles) are in our bylaws.

These "changing of the guard" elections are critically important for every organization, including ours; it's always important to have fresh faces and new ideas in the leadership mix.



Any City of Charlottesville resident who's a registered voter, supports the Democratic Party, and is willing to do a bit of organizing work to help us win in November (especially newcomers!).





Preaching BEYOND the Choir (Why electing Dems matters!)

"The first House of Delegates and Senate bills Democrats filed seek to increase the minimum wage to \$13.50 per hour as of Jan. 1, 2025, and to \$15 per hour as of

Jan. 1, 2026. Currently, minimum wage is \$12 per hour in Virginia, and the federal minimum wage is \$7.25 per hour — a number that has not changed in over a decade....In 2021, Democratic legislators passed a bill to put the brakes on some pollution from tailpipe

emissions by hitching Virginia to California's emissions standards... Some Virginia Republicans are trying again to undo this after unsuccessful attempts in 2023...Democrats are trying again to pass a proposal to ban future sales of assault-style weapons...Democrats put forth a proposed constitutional amendment that would make restoration of rights constitutionally guaranteed for felons who have completed their sentences...Since Democrats retained control of the Senate and flipped the House, Republican lawmakers are unlikely to pass the proposal Youngkin backed to bar most abortions after 15 weeks with exceptions for rape, incest and the life of the pregnant person. In 2024, Democrats will attempt to enshrine protections into the state's constitution." *Richmond Times-Dispatch*, 1/2/24

"Major drug companies massively cut insulin prices... Sanofi, Eli Lily and Novo Nordisk have all cut insulin prices starting January 1, 2024, after raising prices in recent years. Starting today, all three major insulin manufacturers are offering \$35/mo caps on out-of-pocket costs. Also today, they're cutting list prices by 70% or more -a move that's expected to *save* them hundreds of millions of dollars a year."

"A federal appeals court on Tuesday ruled that Texas hospitals and doctors are not obligated to perform abortions under a long-standing national emergency-care law, dealing a blow to the White House's strategy to ensure access to the procedure after the Supreme Court overturned the

constitutional right to abortion in 2022....all three judges on the 5th Circuit's panel were appointed by Republican presidents. Judge Leslie H. Southwick is a George W. Bush appointee, and Judges Kurt D. Engelhardt and Cory T. Wilson are Trump appointees." *Washington Post, 1/3/24*

"The Texas Supreme Court has overturned a court order that would have allowed a Dallas woman to get an abortion. The ruling came down hours after Kate Cox's lawyers announced she was leaving the state to terminate her non-viable



pregnancy. Last Tuesday, Cox, 31, filed a historic lawsuit, asking the courts to allow her to terminate her pregnancy after she learned her fetus had full trisomy 18, a lethal fetal anomaly. The lawsuit, brought by the Center for Reproductive Rights, said continuing the pregnancy posed a threat to Cox's health and future fertility, but her doctors refused to perform an abortion due to the state's near-total ban on the procedure." *The Texas Tribune, 12/11/23*
