Caucus and Full Committee Meeting on April 22

There will be a brief full Cville Dems meeting followed by a Caucus in Charlottesville on Monday, April 22, Swanson Case Room, Central Library branch (explained below). Doors will open at 6 pm, followed by the meeting

6:30-6:50 pm. Registration for the Caucus will begin at 7pm, and the

Caucus will begin at 7:30pm.

The Caucus is an event to elect Charlottesville delegates and alternates to attend both the Fifth Congressional District Democratic Convention (May 18 in Fluvanna County) and the DPVA State Convention (June 22 in Richmond). If you'd like to be elected as a Charlottesville delegate or alternate, you must pre-file (see article just below). We need to elect 14 delegates plus three alternates at the Caucus – yes, we need 17 people to volunteer for this important Democratic representation of Charlottesville at both the Fifth District convention and the DPVA State convention in Richmond. Delegates must attend both conventions. It is satisfying and enjoyable to be part of this political process, which goes all the way to determining the next President and Vice President.

How Can I Become a Charlottesville Delegate at the Caucus?

Every Presidential election year, Democrats in each city and county must meet in a Caucus to elect Delegates to attend both the Congressional District Convention(s) and the State Convention and help elect Virginia's delegation to the National Democratic Convention in August. The Charlottesville Democratic Committee (Cville Dems) calls and runs the Caucus, which is open to every Democrat registered to vote in the City of Charlottesville.

This year, Charlottesville Democrats need to elect 14 Delegates and 3 alternates to the 5th Congressional District Democratic Convention and to the DPVA State Convention.

Some frequently asked questions:

What does a Delegate do?

- A Delegate attends the Congressional District Caucus in May and the State Convention in June, both single day events (see below for dates).
- At the Congressional District Convention, Delegates from the Fifth District will elect 5 District-Level Delegates to the National Convention in Chicago, as well as a District-level Presidential Elector.
- At the State Convention, Delegates from the Commonwealth will elect Virginia's state-wide representatives to the National Convention in Chicago (At-Large Delegates and Alternates to the National Convention, Pledged Party Leaders and Elected Officials), two At-Large Presidential Electors, and Virginia's members of the Democratic National Committee for the next four

years.

What does an Alternate do?

• An Alternate fills in for a Delegate if the Delegate is unable to attend the District or State convention.

When are the District and State Conventions?

- May 18 5th Congressional District Convention, 11am, at Fluvanna County High School
- June 22 State Convention, 10am, Richmond Convention Center

How do I get to be a Delegate or an Alternate from Charlottesville to the Congressional District and State Conventions?

- You must pre-file to be a Delegate or Alternate, so that your name can be on the ballot for the caucus. To pre-file, fill out the online 2024 State Delegate and Alternate Filing Form. You can pre-file from now until 5pm on April 15. You do NOT need to be a member of the Full Committee to become a delegate or an alternate from Charlottesville – any Democrat registered to vote in the City of Charlottesville can pre-file and, if elected, serve as a delegate or alternate.
- Delegates will be elected at the Charlottesville Democratic Caucus on April 22 at 7:30pm.
- The Call to Caucus has been issued on our Cville Dems website and other sites/publications and has more information about location and rules (see the link in the article above).
- If the number of people who have pre-filed is less than the number of slots to be filled, all candidates who have pre-filed will be automatically elected and the Caucus will be canceled.




Preaching BEYOND the Choir (Why electing Dems matters!)

This year's election cycle, we don't need to tell you, is not going to be a joyride in the Blue Ridge. A lot of factors are making election outcomes uncertain. Unfounded fear of a wonky economy (see talking points at whitehouse.gov or above to address this with friends and frenemies). Possible evidence of more forgetfulness, verbal blunders, and violent language from the Former Guy. Additional candidates running for president and people using their Democratic primary votes to register protests. The point is, we need all the votes we can get for Joe Biden as the candidate who can and once already did beat Trump.



"More recently, his [RFK JR.'s] activism has veered into conspiracies and contradicted scientific consensus, most infamously on vaccines. Some members of his family have publicly criticized his views. Dozens of his family members posed with President Joe Biden at a St. Patrick's Day reception at the White House in a photo his sister Kerry Kennedy posted to social media. Kennedy founded Waterkeeper Alliance, which works to secure clean water, and Children's Health Defense, an anti-vaccine group that saw its reach grow

rapidly during the pandemic. Children's Health Defense has a lawsuit pending against a number of news organizations, among them The Associated Press, accusing them of violating antitrust laws by taking action to identify misinformation, including about COVID-19 and COVID-19 vaccines. Kennedy took leave from the group when he announced his run for president but is listed as one of its attorneys in the lawsuit." WBUR, 3/18/24



"The organisers of Listen to Michigan — an effort to protest Joe Biden's policy towards Israel's war in Gaza — have a message for the United States president: The conflict is not a 'niche' issue for only some segments of the political left. Listen to Michigan emerged earlier this year as a grassroots movement focused on the state's primary. It called on voters to cast 'uncommitted votes' instead of backing Biden's reelection effort, in an attempt to signal displeasure

over the president's stance on the war.... Layla Elabed, a key Michigan organiser, said during a news conference on Monday. [Elabed:] 'Today, we launched our national movement to let you all know uncommitted voters aren't going anywhere, and we aren't backing down until we achieve a permanent ceasefire." *Al Jazeera*, 3/18/24
